

Marc Denis-Everell, a key player in the push for increased science capacity in government, left his position as Assistant DM of the Earth Sciences Sector of Natural Resources Canada to take up his new duties, in July 2000 as Assistant DM of the Meteorological Service of Canada (MSC) at Environment Canada.

He was a research scientist from 1970 to 1975, before taking up positions in the university and provincial government sectors until 1987. During his six-year tenure with MSC, Everell signed the documents at the Inauguration Ceremony for the North American Ensemble Forecast System. He also oversaw widely distributed MSC personnel and dealt with issues such as climate change, water quantity, air pollution, ice forecasting and improved information to the public, and private sector initiatives in several technology areas.
