# Informal notes on a meeting of the CMOS Ottawa Centre Executive

Wednesday, 23 January 2019

**Venue:** Rideau Canal Junior Ranks Mess, 4 Queen Elizabeth Drive, Ottawa **Present:** Dawn Conway (Chair), Yvon Bernier, Bob Jones, Ann McMillan, Ray Desjardins.

Regrets from all other members due to poor weather conditions restricting their ability to get to the meeting, and other reasons. Since there was no quorum, these notes are an informal record of the meeting.

1. The **agenda** was adopted following the addition of an item under 'Other Business'. The item stemmed from a request from the National CMOS Student Representative.

2. A decision on adoption of the **minutes** of the meetings of 11 December 2018 was deferred due to the lack of a quorum.

3. **Actions arising** from the past meeting: All actions from the December 11 meeting (Table attached) have been completed.

## 4. **Report on CMOS Centre Chairs meeting**

The Chair reported on the CMOS Centre Chairs meeting of January 10, 2019.

- The Committee of Centre Chairs has been combined with the Membership Committee to create a new 'Centre Chairs and Membership' Committee.
- Centre Chairs were again asked to nominate members to serve on the School and Public Education Committee.
- Planning is underway for the 2021 Congress in Victoria. David Fissel is the LAC Chair; Ken Denman is the SPC Chair.
- CMOS has 809 active members as of January 1, 2019. There was a discussion on new members. It was felt that while membership was to be encouraged, more information was needed about applicants.
- A slide deck on CMOS requires updating. This will be done with input from Jones and Conway of the Ottawa Centre.
- Project Maury will continue to be co-sponsored by CNC/SCOR. Project Atmosphere needs a new co-sponsor.

The various CMOS Centres reported on their activities. Conway will contact Sarah Knight about a Bulletin article on Ray Desjardins' Order of Canada.

## 5. Ottawa Centre's Annual report to CMOS

The draft report, which was based on a template provided by CMOS was reviewed and accepted. CMOS has asked for information on Members' terms on the Ottawa Executive. Since all but 3 positions are approved annually, this will be dealt with by a note on the report.

## 6. 2020 Congress Update

A report was not provided at this time. Desjardins noted the need for sessions on agriculture, as it is a vital element in resilience.

- Centre executive met prior to each luncheon. The Centre executive includes student representatives from the University of Ottawa and nominally, from Carleton University.
- Participated in the Ottawa Regional Science Fair held April 6-7, 2018 at Carleton University. Michael Steeves, Greg Steeves and Martin Gauthier judged the dozen projects (of a total of 200), that qualified for the CMOS prizes. Two prizes were presented.
- Participated in the Expo-Sciences 2017 Outaouais Regional Fair held in Gatineau March 23-25, 2018. Of the 77 projects on display, three qualified for CMOS prizes. Two prizes were presented.
