3. Schedule of lunch speakers

Francis Zwiers, director, president and CEO of the Pacific Climate Impacts Consortium (PCIC) is the February speaker on the topic of Climate change. The title of his presentation is "Changing Extremes – is it real or just imagined?"

The Canadian Association of the Club of Rome (CACOR) has invited the CMOS Ottawa chapter to jointly sponsor a talk on April 20 2016 at their venue, The Army Mess, 149 Somerset St. W (please note there is a dress code at this venue). The speaker would be Robert Sandford, and the topic would be on water.

Ann McMillan is working on finalizing arrangements with Meteorological Service of Canada (MSC) to have one of their DGs to present in May. Michel Jean, the Director General, Canadian Centre for Meteorological and Environmental Prediction, in Dorval was a suggested candidate.
