

## Meeting of the CMOS Ottawa Centre Executive

Monday, 4 May 2021

1. The Chair welcomed the Executive to the meeting. It was moved by Yvon Bernier and seconded by Bob Jones to adopt the agenda. All were in favour.
2. It was moved by Denis Bourque and seconded by Helen Joseph to approve the minutes of the meeting of 22 March 2021. All were in favour.
3. **Update on actions from the last meeting**

#### 4. Financial Report

The Treasurer reported that there were no issues or any new developments to report for the finances, including investments.

#### 5. Recent talks and ZOOM matters

- a) the Ward and Drever talks, Zoom management (4 & 18 March resp.)
- For the talk by Mark Ward (4 March 2021): 53 screens participated in the session. 29 (55%) of these were CMOS members; 3 (6%) were Students; 1 of these students are amongst the 29 CMOS Members. 66 registrations were recorded, therefore, 80% attended.
  - The Drever talk is still not posted on YouTube, pending publication of Dr. Drever's paper. There were 49 participants (half of them were CMOS members); 79 had registered; 69% participation which is in line with other talks.
- b) the Niemi and Twidle talks (8 and 29 April, resp.)
- For the talk by Andrea Niemi (8 April): 35 screens participated in the session. 21 (60%) of these were CMOS members; 3 (9%) were Students; 1 of these students are amongst the 21 CMOS Members. 45 registrations were recorded, therefore, 78% attended.
  - For the talk by Laura Twidle (29 April): 81 screens participated in the session. 47 (58%) of these were CMOS members (the lowest of all the talks); 25 were from Private sector and 12 from academia; 5 (6%) were Students; 3 of these students are amongst the 47 CMOS Members. 107 registrations were recorded, therefore, 76% attended.

- c) CMOS Ottawa members from the Kingston area participating in the luncheon talks
- The Executive was reminded of how this query started. It was meant to gauge the level of interest of people from that area (including those at Queens U and RMC Kingston) in CMOS, particularly in the activities of the CMOS Ottawa Centre. The Kingston area falls within the scope of the Ottawa Centre, but the Centre does not have student representatives from Queens or the RMC, nor extensive interaction with students and faculty there. Persons that participate in the virtual talks might be interested in stronger engagement with the Ottawa Centre.

Denis noted that it is actually difficult to answer this question based on information available from participants at the virtual talks. E-mail addresses used can be g-mail and other types that say nothing about affiliation or location of the user. Also people sometimes use e-mail addresses of universities even if they are not currently active with these institutions. Bob Jones noted that of the CMOS members affiliated with the Ottawa Centre (approx. 93), three are from the Kingston area.

In general discussion, the number of private sector participants at the Twidle talk was interesting, and perhaps more effort could be made to reach out to them for stronger engagement with the Ottawa Centre. The work undertaken by Ada Loewen and Abby Dalton to communicate CMOS and the Ottawa Centre's activities to students and faculty at CarletonU and U. Ottawa and more broadly to their networks is very helpful. An e-mail survey to participants on the virtual talks, to ask about offers to give talks, or generate ideas for talks they would like to hear could potentially be of benefit. First, the Centre should mine information from the talks this season to develop ideas. **ACTION:** Denis will review the talks held this 2020-21 season and will provide his analysis to the Executive at the next meeting.

## 6. Schedule of Speakers 2020-2021 season and beyond

All talks organized by the Centre for the 2020-21 season have been completed (See **Table 1**). For the 2021-22 season, many suggestions (some quite tentative at present) were made. The Executive will continue to propose topics and speakers with the objective of firming up and scheduling at least 4 talks for the Sept-Dec period later this year. Some ideas may arise from the talks scheduled for the upcoming Congress in Victoria. It was recognized that March and April are particularly busy times for students and that, in general, one talk per month should be enough to manage.

It was decided that this activity would be managed over the next several months, with a review of progress at the next meeting. **ACTION:** Leslie will assemble a list of those suggestions already discussed and circulate it to the Executive. **ACTION:** All members of the Executive will propose amendments and additions to that list and be prepared to select from the options at the next meeting.

As to past Actions, Abby has not yet spoken with Jackie Dawson's group, and Ada Loewen has not yet contacted Profs Gruber and Burn. These actions are still pending.

## 7. Elections, Ottawa Centre, 2021

Dawn Conway informed the Executive that she had contacted all current CMOS Members in good standing associated with the Ottawa Centre; presented the proposed slate; and asked for nominations. No comments or nominations have been offered. Dawn also contacted every current elected member of the Ottawa Executive, to see who wished to continue and who preferred to step down. Only Paul Pestieau wished to step down.

The Executive was very pleased that the student representatives, Abigail (Abby) Dalton from U. Ottawa, and Ada Loewen from Carleton U. have agreed to continue in these roles for another year.

The next step in this process would either be to present this list to the Members and hold an election or to adopt this by acclamation. Given that there was no response from the Members (i.e. no objections raised, and no additions proposed), the Executive unanimously agreed the slate should be acclaimed as stated above. **ACTIONS:** Dawn Conway will prepare a message to Members informing of this decision, noting that all members had been consulted, and Bob Jones will disseminate it.

## 8. Science Fairs 2021

Yvon Bernier reminded the Executive that the Science Fair in Outaouais is in two parts. The first phase (secondary school level) was completed on 21 March. The second phase (primary school level) will be completed by 9 May. He and Serge Nadon are the judges representing the CMOS Ottawa Centre. After both phases have been completed, a full report with the details will be prepared. **ACTION:** Yvon Bernier will prepare a report on the 2021 Outaouais Science Fair and submit it to the Executive.

Len Barrie, Abby Dalton and Ada Loewen represented the Ottawa Centre as judges for the Ottawa Science Fair CMOS award. In addition, Abby and Ada registered as general judges for any project presented at the science fair. Ada said there was a good range of topics covered overall, and that participating had been a good experience.

The CMOS Awards for best projects related to weather, climate, oceans and environment were:

Winner: Joshua Auer (Ashbury College)  
project 1203 'Clean energy from dirty bananas'.  
Runner-up: Anerie Patel (Cedarview Middle School)  
project 1301 'How the greenhouse effect affects plant growth'

Len noted that delivery of the cash awards is in progress.

The trophy will need to have the plaque engraved after the pandemic restrictions are lifted. Presentation of the trophy will take place after that. Len is developing a certificate to present to the winners. The Executive agreed to the purchase of frames for the certificates. These can be bought at Michaels. **ACTION:** Denis will send the SKU to Len for a basic frame. **ACTIONS:** Len will finalize the certificates, purchase two frames, and mail the framed certificates to the award winners.

## 9. Other business

### 9.1 Contact with Queens U.

Abby Dalton (not present) updated the Chair prior to the meeting on having had no response yet from Laura Thomson (Queens U.) regarding the interaction with the Ottawa Centre. While waiting for contact with Dr Thompson, it was agreed to reach out to other contacts at Queens. **ACTION:** John Stone will write to John Smol to gauge interest in developing a closer relationship between Queens U and the Ottawa Centre.

### 9.2 Pamphlets

Sheila Bourque proposed verifying with ECCC that they would allow re-publication of any of the content in the old pamphlets and to contact Jim Abraham to ask whether CMOS National might be interested in getting involved. It was noted that the CMOS Committee on School and Public Education (SPEC) might be relevant to this. **ACTION:** Sheila will contact Jim Abraham to discuss the pamphlets (e.g. updating, revising, re-publishing).

### 9.3 CMOS Scientific Committee

The CMOS Scientific Committee is identified on the CMOS web site, along with its Terms of Reference. One activity normally undertaken by the Scientific Committee is in selection of scholarship winners. Another is the development of CMOS position statements on climate. John Stone is a member of that Committee but has not had recent information on it or seen any activity by that Committee. The Executive were reminded that in the recent efforts by CMOS National to hold a Governance Review, and to update its Strategic Plan and Implementation Plan, CMOS plans to review all current committees and look at any that might

have fallen dormant. **ACTION:** Barry Goodison will raise this at the upcoming Centre Chairs meeting.

**10. Date of Next Meeting of the Ottawa Centre Executive**

It was noted that the CMOS Annual General Meeting (AGM) is scheduled for 22 June 2021. The next meeting for the Centre (again, virtual) will take place, by Zoom, on the afternoon of Tuesday, 29 June 2021, from 3:00 to 4:30 pm.

**10. Adjournment**

The meeting adjourned at 16:50. The Chair thanked all participants for an excellent discussion.
